Inspection

- Always inspect glass for scratches, abrasions, cracks or chips before using or cleaning.
- · Safely dispose of any damaged glass.
- Inspect glass routinely for strain with a polariscope.

Washing/Cleaning

- Always inspect glass for chips and fractures prior to cleaning, especially any solvent or acid cleaning.
- Use Alconox or similar type detergents.
- · Avoid HF, strong alkalis or abrasive cleaners.
- Distilled water rinse.

Storage

 Store glass in a manner to avoid vessels bumping each other.

Temperature, Borosilicate Glass

- Standard use limit: 240°C
- Maximum very short-term use: 400°C
- Maximum allowable temperature differential (ΔT) 80°C.
- Avoid rapid temperature changes or rapid thermal shock.

Heating Glass

- Common heating methods include mantles, heat tapes, guns and immersion heaters.

- Avoid direct flame as much as possible.
